

## **Requirements And Procedures for issuing and renewing work licenses for marine works contractors**

**1- Marine works contractors working in receiving and handling ship waste must obtain licenses to practice the activity from the Port Authority. The following are the requirements for issuing and renewing work licenses for marine works contractors.**

**2- The works contractor shall complete all documents required to issue a work permit as follows:**

- A copy of the national ID card and the criminal status newspaper.**
- Activity establishment contract.**
- Company ownership contract.**
- Membership certificate from the Chamber of Navigation.**
- An extract from the commercial registry proving the activity**
- Customs Authority certificate**
- 5 pledges stipulated in Resolution No. 800 of 2016.**

**3- The issued capital must not be less than 250 thousand Egyptian pounds (two hundred and fifty thousand Egyptian pounds) for each activity separately.**

**4- Licensees are obligated to provide an insurance amounting to 5,000 Egyptian pounds (five thousand Egyptian pounds) in cash or by an unconditional bank letter of guarantee to the competent port authority, which shall be returned immediately upon expiration of the license.**

**5- The license applicant pays in exchange for issuing or renewing the license to carry out the marine works/marine supplies activity an amount of 3000 Egyptian pounds (three thousand Egyptian pounds) for each activity separately (marine works) (marine supplies) and in exchange for the benefit of 3000 Egyptian pounds (three thousand Egyptian pounds). .**

**6- The license period is three years and may be renewed for other similar periods if the necessary conditions and controls are met.**

**7- All companies working in transporting ship waste from the port to the final safe disposal destinations must obtain environmental approvals to practice this activity, a contract for the safe disposal of these wastes, and a license to practice the activity of collecting and transporting non-hazardous waste from the Waste Management Regulatory Authority.**
